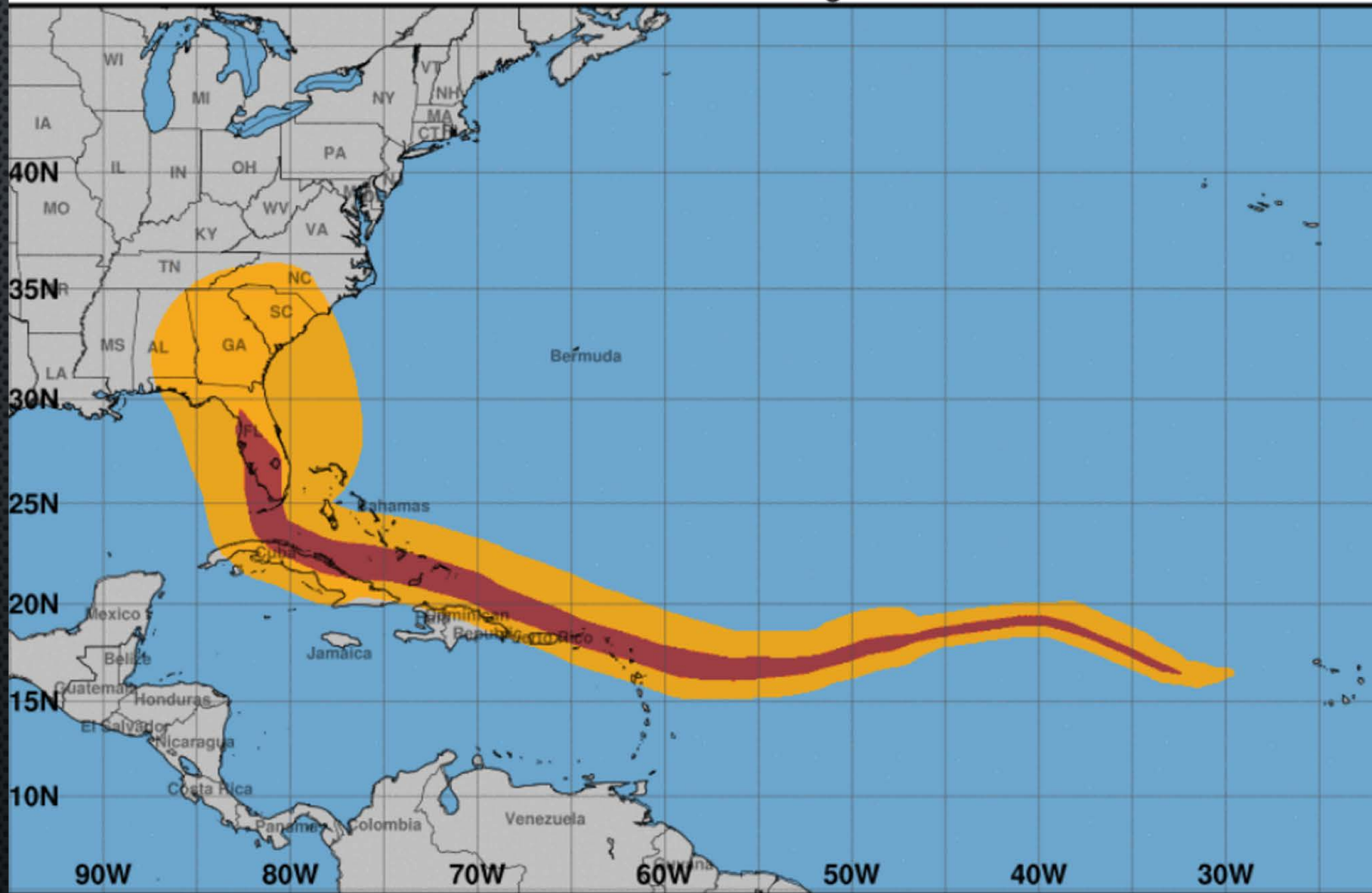

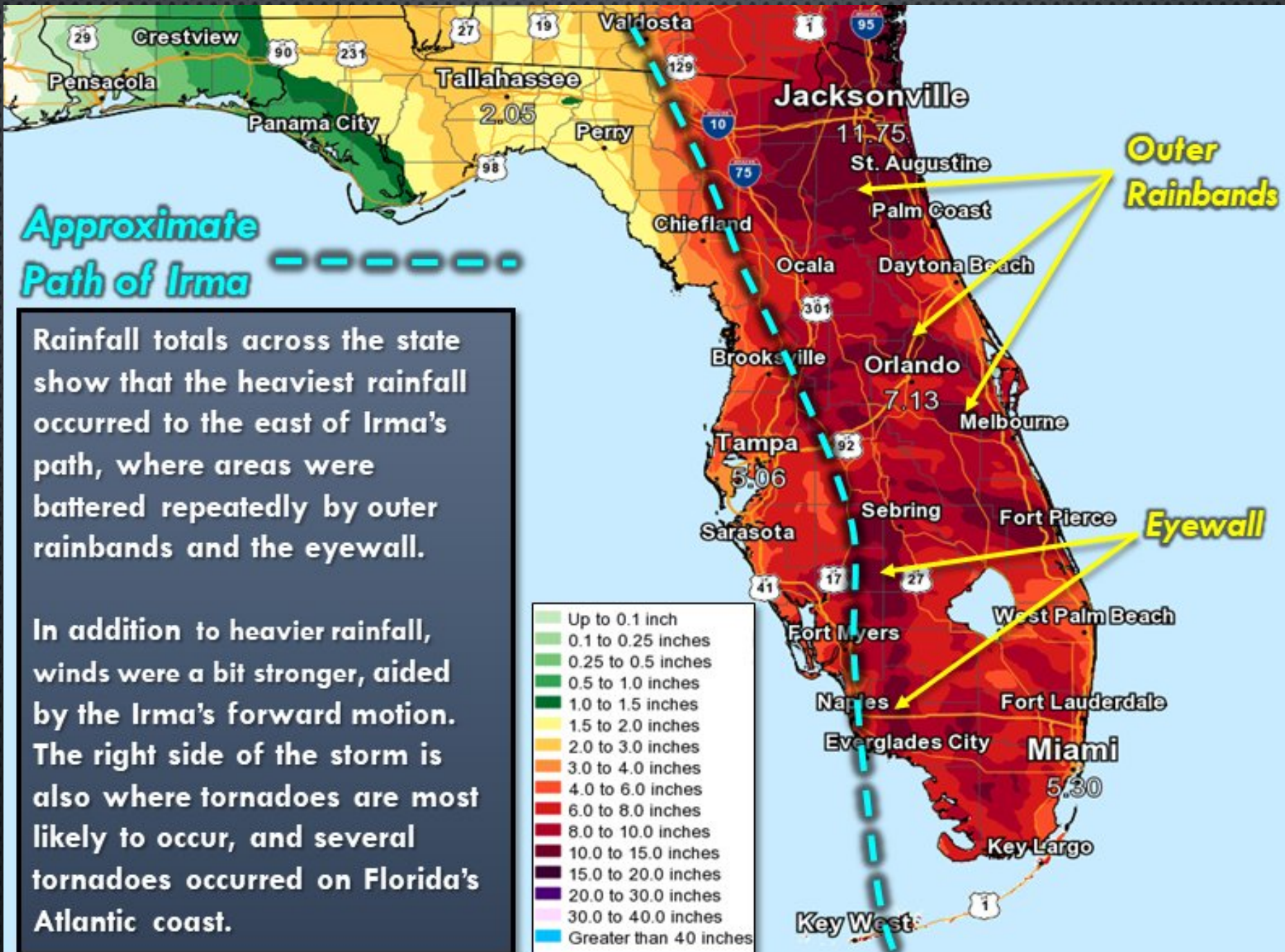

Florida petroleum product supply





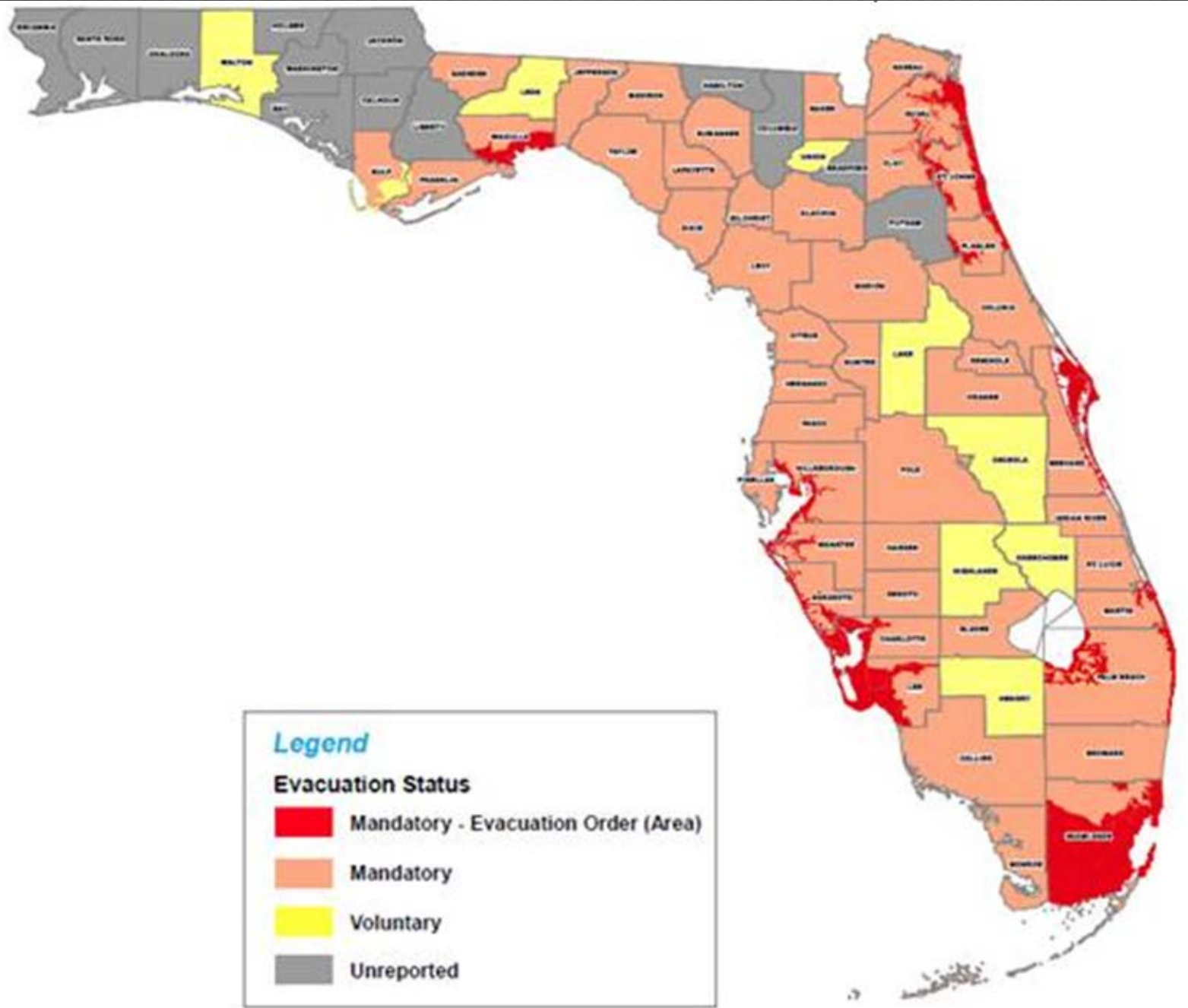
Approximate Path of Irma

Rainfall totals across the state show that the heaviest rainfall occurred to the east of Irma's path, where areas were battered repeatedly by outer rainbands and the eyewall.

In addition to heavier rainfall, winds were a bit stronger, aided by the Irma's forward motion. The right side of the storm is also where tornadoes are most likely to occur, and several tornadoes occurred on Florida's Atlantic coast.
